PURPOSE

These Reservation Regulations are adopted by the Miami Nation pursuant to Chapter 4 of the Intertribal Wildlife Code and the Intertribal Wildlife Management and Reciprocity Compact.

These Regulations establish wildlife management requirements unique to the Miami Nation and supplement the Intertribal Wildlife Code. Unless specifically modified herein, all provisions of the Intertribal Wildlife Code remain in full force and effect within the boundaries of the Miami Nation Reservation.

SECTION 1

Authority

These Reservation Regulations are adopted by the Miami Nation pursuant to Chapter 4 of the Intertribal Wildlife Code and the Intertribal Wildlife Management and Reciprocity Compact.

These Regulations apply solely within the jurisdiction of the Miami Nation Reservation.

Nothing contained herein shall be construed as limiting or diminishing the inherent sovereign authority of the Miami Nation.

SECTION 2

Lands and Waters Covered

These Regulations apply to all lands and waters located within the boundaries of the Miami Nation Reservation over which the Miami Nation exercises jurisdiction or wildlife management authority, including lands and waters owned, held in trust, restricted, leased, managed, or otherwise controlled by the Miami Nation.

Certain lands and waters owned, leased, managed, or otherwise controlled by the Miami Nation may require a **Miami Nation Property Access Permit ("Property Access Permit")**, in addition to a valid hunting, fishing, trapping, or other applicable license issued by a participating tribe under the Intertribal Wildlife Management and Reciprocity Compact. Requirements governing the **Property Access Permit** are set forth in **Section 4** of these Regulations.

SECTION 3

Reservation Access

Any person enrolled in a signatory tribe of the Intertribal Wildlife Compact and engaged in any hunting, fishing, trapping, gathering, or otherwise participating in outdoor recreation activities within the Miami Nation Reservation shall:

1. Possess a valid hunting, fishing, trapping, or other applicable license issued by a federally recognized Tribal Nation that is a signatory to the Intertribal Wildlife Management and Reciprocity Compact.
2. Comply with the Intertribal Wildlife Code.
3. Comply with these Miami Nation Wildlife Regulations.
4. Comply with all applicable Miami Nation laws, regulations, and posted property restrictions.

Nothing contained in this section shall be construed as granting access to Miami Nation-owned or managed properties.

SECTION 4

Miami Nation Property Access Permit

The Miami Nation recognizes valid hunting, fishing, trapping, and other applicable licenses issued by federally recognized Tribal Nations participating in the Intertribal Wildlife Management and Reciprocity Compact.

Access to Miami Nation-owned, leased, managed, or otherwise controlled lands and waters for hunting or fishing is limited to enrolled Miami Nation tribal citizens and the spouses of enrolled Miami Nation tribal citizens.

Eligible individuals shall obtain a valid **Property Access Permit** prior to entering tribal properties for hunting or fishing activities.

Property Access Permits shall be administered through the **Miami Nation Headquarters**. Applicants shall contact **Mary Eullitt** to obtain Property Access Permit applications, current property access requirements, maps, and applicable regulations.

Issuance of a **Property Access Permit** is contingent upon the applicant:

- Being an enrolled Miami Nation tribal citizen or the spouse of an enrolled Miami Nation tribal citizen;
- Possessing a valid hunting or fishing license recognized under the Intertribal Wildlife Management and Reciprocity Compact;
- Agreeing to abide by the Intertribal Wildlife Code;
- Agreeing to abide by these Miami Nation Wildlife Regulations;
- Complying with all property-specific rules established by the Miami Nation.

The Miami Nation reserves the exclusive authority to:

- Issue, deny, suspend, revoke, or restrict Property Access Permits;
- Limit the number of Property Access Permits issued;
- Restrict access to designated properties;
- Temporarily close any property for conservation, habitat management, public safety, cultural activities, or other governmental purposes.

Possession of a valid hunting or fishing license **does not authorize entry onto Miami Nation-owned or managed properties without a valid Property Access Permit.**

Nothing contained in these Regulations or the Intertribal Wildlife Management and Reciprocity Compact shall be interpreted as creating a public right of access to lands owned, leased, managed, or otherwise controlled by the Miami Nation.

SECTION 5

Miami Nation-Owned and Managed Properties

Miami Nation-owned, leased, managed, or otherwise controlled lands and waters may be opened for hunting and fishing by official action of the Miami Nation.

At this time, **only enrolled Miami Nation tribal citizens and the spouses of enrolled Miami Nation tribal citizens who possess a valid Property Access Permit may hunt or fish on designated Miami Nation-owned or managed properties.**

All permitted individuals shall comply with:

- The Intertribal Wildlife Code;
- These Miami Nation Wildlife Regulations;
- Any property-specific restrictions;
- Any conditions established as part of the Property Access Permit.

The Miami Nation reserves the authority to open, close, restrict, or otherwise regulate access to any property under its jurisdiction at any time for wildlife management, conservation, habitat

restoration, public safety, cultural or ceremonial activities, infrastructure improvements, or other governmental purposes.

SECTION 6

Special Draw Hunts

The Miami Nation may establish special hunting or fishing opportunities by official action, including but not limited to:

- Youth Hunts
- Veteran Hunts
- Mobility-Impaired Hunts
- Tribal Citizen Hunts
- Conservation Hunts
- Educational Hunts

Eligibility requirements, application procedures, and hunt regulations shall be established by the Miami Nation before each event.

SECTION 7

Cultural Harvest

Nothing contained within these Regulations shall prohibit traditional cultural harvest activities specifically authorized by the Miami Nation in accordance with tribal law and applicable federal law.

SECTION 8

Emergency Closures

The Miami Nation may temporarily suspend or restrict hunting, fishing, trapping, or public access to lands or waters under its jurisdiction whenever necessary to protect:

- Wildlife resources;

- Public safety;
- Cultural resources;
- Natural resources;
- Habitat restoration projects; or
- Other governmental interests.

Emergency closures shall remain in effect until rescinded by the Miami Nation.

Adoption

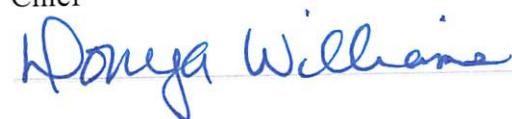
